- Serve as the instructional leader for all Jewish Studies and Hebrew teaching, ensuring strong curriculum, teaching practices and outcomes
- Oversee Jewish Studies faculty, Middle School Hebrew Coordinator, and Hebrew faculty
- Determine best ways to assess student progress in the Jewish Studies and Hebrew departments and execute the plan
- Lead and facilitate faculty leading the Tefillah, Parashiot Studies, Kabbalat Shabbat and chagim programs.
- · Teach classes as needed
- Coordinate Tikkun Olam opportunities for students and families
- Collaborate with all faculty and staff for school–wide Jewish holiday celebrations, as well as effective ways to integrate Jewish learning into secular studies as appropriate.
