BACKGROUND

The Organization

For more than a century, The Associated: Jewish Federation of Baltimore, alongside their family of community agencies, has been the cornerstone of building a dynamic community that cares for one another and inspires its neighbors to work together to create a world of good.

The Associated is recognized as one of the top giving Jewish communities in North America and a national leader within the Federation system. The Annual Campaign, the base of The Associated's philanthropic efforts, raised approximately \$30 million in 2023, serving as the central fundraising vehicle for all system agencies. That support is augmented by another \$20 million in endowment and grant revenue from its endowments, affiliated supporting foundations, and donor advised funds. Recently, The Associated completed an unprecedented \$200 million capital and endowment Centennial Campaign, charting the course for its second century. With a diverse real estate portfolio and a robust endowment and investment program totaling nearly \$1 billion in assets, The Associated is well-positioned for sustained impact.

The Associated is looking for someone to partner with newly appointed President and CEO, Andrew Cushnir, to enhance its comprehensive fundraising capacity and infrastructure and help lead the organization through this next phase of growth. The organization's leadership is deeply committed to its fundraising success, and to new and innovative strategies for revenue diversity that strengthen the Baltimore Jewish community.

The CDO will lead and inspire a diverse and experienced development team, driving annual, capital and endowment fundraising efforts, targeted strategic philanthropy projects, and new initiatives. In addition to managing these core activities, the CDO will provide strategic oversight to The Associated's robust-donor-advised fund and foundation programs. Collaborating closely with both lay and professional senior leadership, the CDO will play a critical role in setting and achieving ambitious fundraising goals that align with agency-wide and community priorities.

The CDO will lead three direct reports and oversee the entire Development department, which consists of 20 staff members.


