INTRODUCTION

Shalom School is Sacramento's only Jewish day school, serving children from 18 months through 6th grade. Rooted in Jewish values and traditions, it offers a warm, inclusive, and academically rigorous environment for families of all backgrounds. The school welcomes both Jewish and non-Jewish students, embracing a wide spectrum of Jewish practices and making Jewish life accessible and meaningful to all.

At Shalom School, strong academics are interwoven with Jewish values, fostering pride in

Jewish heritage, joy in Jewish living, and a deep connection to Israel. As one parent shared, "Here, it feels like a great place to be Jewish."



The school is known for its vibrant, community-oriented culture. Families form deep, lasting connections, and the "open-door" atmosphere makes everyone feel at home. Parents are actively involved, and children genuinely love being at school—so much that they often don't want to leave! Families describe Shalom School as foundational to their Jewish identity and community life, offering lifelong friendships, dedicated educators, and a strong academic foundation.

Shalom School provides a safe and nurturing environment where the whole child is supported —academically, socially, and emotionally. The secure campus and programs like buddy pairings foster relationships across age groups and strengthen the sense of community.

Founded in 1978 as a community Jewish day school, Shalom School began with a small preschool and grew to a peak enrollment of around 300 students in the 1990s. In 2007, it moved to its current location in the Arden-Arcade area of Sacramento. Although the campus is situated on the property of Mosaic Law Congregation, a Conservative synagogue, Shalom School is a community school and is not affiliated with any specific congregation. Families from approximately 29 zip codes—some traveling up to an hour—choose Shalom School for its exceptional community and educational experience.

Leadership Opportunity

The Head of School is responsible for advancing the mission and vision of Shalom School, as defined by the Board of Trustees. In partnership with a dedicated administrative team, the Head of School oversees the day-to-day operations and strategic direction of the school. The Board and Head of School share a strong, collaborative relationship, with lay leaders deeply committed to the school's continued success.

ACADEMICS & PROGRAMMING

Shalom School offers a professional, data-informed academic program aligned with educational standards, while nurturing a lifelong love of learning. Elementary teachers are fully credentialed, and all faculty are experienced Jewish educators—some Jewish, some not—who integrate values-based learning into daily instruction.

The elementary program follows a multi-age classroom philosophy, designed to support both social development and differentiated instruction. The school currently has four sections: Kindergarten, 1/2 Classroom, 3/4 Classroom, and 5/6 Classroom. These are not traditional "combo" classes where students are taught separately by grade. Instead, each multi-age cohort —typically 17–20 students—is treated as a unified learning section. Teachers assess students both individually and as a group, tailoring instruction to meet each child's unique strengths, needs, and academic growth.



Students are supported and challenged through personalized learning opportunities, including the ability to "level up" in subjects like math. The curriculum is carefully selected and research-based, with programs such as Eureka Math Squared and Mystery Science used in general studies, alongside a strong Hebrew and Judaic studies curriculum. All general studies curricula are aligned with the Common Core State Standards (CCSS) and Next Generation Science Standards (NGSS), ensuring academic rigor and consistency. The school is committed to academic excellence and is also deeply dedicated to fostering Social and Emotional Learning (SEL) to support the holistic development of every student. All K-6 students participate in a robust enrichment program that includes Physical Education, Art, Music, STEAM, and Media/Library. Students receive ongoing assessments and personalized report cards to track progress and growth.

The preschool program is thriving, including a newly reopened 18-month-old classroom that already has a waiting list. Accredited by NAEYC, the preschool exceeds state requirements with lower student-to-teacher ratios (as low as 1:6 compared to the typical 1:12) and a high standard of care. It is one of the few programs in the region with this level of accreditation—and the only one at an independent school.

Across all grade levels, Shalom School fosters curiosity, confidence, and a love of learning. Small class sizes and a nurturing environment allow faculty and staff to know each student by name and tailor instruction to their academic needs and interests. Students are empowered to engage meaningfully with the world around them, supported by a community that values both excellence and belonging.





JEWISH LIFE & COMMUNITY

A defining feature of the Shalom School experience—for both students and families—is its vibrant, joyful, and inclusive Jewish community. Grounded in Jewish values, traditions, and celebrations, the school fosters a deep love for Jewish life in ways that are engaging, uplifting, and accessible to all.

Each morning begins with a spirited gathering at the school entrance, where students, parents, faculty, and school leaders join in singing and dancing to various versions of Modeh Ani. The joy is palpable and sets a tone of connection and celebration for the day ahead.

Weekly rituals such as Monday morning T'filah and FridayKabbalat Shabbat are cherished moments of spiritual connection. As one parent shared, "Kabbalat Shabbat is the best part of my week. To see joy is amazing—loving each other and their identity, dancing and singing, pure joy. The administration and educators are playful and part of it, dancing with the kids. That is the vibe." T'filah is also a meaningful learning experience, supported by a custom school siddur designed to make prayer approachable and relevant for all students.

Jewish holidays and festivals are celebrated through engaging, school-wide events that deepen students' connection to tradition and community. For example, the annual Hanukkah celebration brings together families, students, and staff in a joyful expression of light, music, and shared heritage.

The Hebrew and Judaic Studies curriculum is rigorous and deeply integrated into the school's academic program. Students explore Jewish history, values, traditions, prayer, spirituality, and Torah, with the goal of developing personal meaning and relevance in their Jewish identity. A spiral curriculum ensures that concepts are introduced early and revisited with increasing depth across grade levels. Jewish themes are woven throughout all subjects and reinforced through weekly themes and monthly values—such as



compassion, respect, cooperation, and tikkun olam (repairing the world)—which resonate with families from all backgrounds.

Through the study of Jewish texts, thoughtful discussions, and hands-on projects, students gain insight into social issues and learn how individuals can make a difference in the world.

A professionalized Hebrew language program, Ulpan Or, excites students and supports meaningful language acquisition. Hebrew instruction is differentiated by ability level, allowing students from diverse backgrounds—including those new to Judaism and those from Hebrew-speaking homes—to thrive. Families value the cognitive and cultural benefits of early exposure to a second language.

Jewish identity at Shalom School also includes a thoughtful and age-appropriate connection to Israel. Students learn about Israeli history, culture, and contemporary life in ways that are nuanced and respectful of diverse perspectives. Israel is celebrated as a vital part of Jewish identity, and students are encouraged to engage with its complexity through inquiry, dialogue, and appreciation.





FACULTY AND ADMINISTRATORS

The faculty and staff at Shalom School embody the school's mission and values, cultivating a community that is both academically rigorous and joyfully rooted in lived Judaism. United by a shared commitment to making a meaningful impact, educators and administrators uphold high standards of care and learning while fostering a nurturing, student-centered environment.

As one parent beautifully put it, "We teach students, not subjects." Every child is known, valued, and supported as an individual. Teachers tailor instruction to meet students' unique needs, helping them grow both academically and personally.

Faculty members feel respected and empowered, supported by a leadership team that treats them as professionals and partners. There is a strong culture of trust, where staff are encouraged to bring their full selves to work and contribute authentically to the school community.

The administrative team operates with open communication, shared purpose, and deep dedication to the school's mission. Together, they ensure that Shalom School delivers not only an excellent academic experience but also a warm, inclusive environment where every student is cared for and every educator is appreciated.
